When you arrive - please pay for your meal at the check in desk, and you will be given a ticket for your meal. The food will be self serve. You can still book attendance only with me by Friday 22nd Sept. Looking forward to a great night of good food, friendship, and good music. And a drink or two.

Worth reiterating:

As previously announced, from September to November the RSL is unable to provide food service.

The committee have organised a caterer for those nights. Menu to the right. The main course and dessert combined only costs \$19!

For those months, the Caterer needs to know meal booking numbers 7 days before club night. So the Monday before. Our meal booking deadline is temporarily 8 days before each club night. The deadline for September was Sunday 17th September.

As usual, Judee will take bookings and provide the check-in desk with the names, and on arrival each member having dinner will pay Jane, the list marked off, and each person will be given the ticket to present for the meal.

So for Members and Guests, you'll just need to make sure you book, arrive & pay on the night, and enjoy a delicious meal. It would also be great if all those coming would consider having a meal so it's a worthwhile night for the caterers.

ITEM 1. Stuart and Frank

Our opening band featured Stuart Cardell vocals, John Calamatta sax, Rory Clark piano, Frank Morgan bass and Paul Phillips on drums.



ITEM 2. Sylvester Kroyherr

Sylvester Kroyherr vocals and guitar. ♪ Sylvester introduced his first song by Paul McCartney **Baby's Request -** written in 1979. McCartney wrote the song for wrote it for his Wings album in 1979.

ITEM 3. Mike Powell and Friends

Mike Powell guitar, Ivan Sultanoff bass guitar, John Calamatta sax, Paul Phillips drums, John Curtis piano.

♪ Mike kicked off with a very cheery Honeysuckle Rose – a 1929 song composed by Thomas "Fats" Waller with lyrics by Andy Razaf. It was introduced in the 1929 Off-Broadway revue Load of Coal.

♫ Then it was the tuneful Bags Groove by Miles Davis, released in 1957 by Prestige Records. ("Bags" was vibraphonist Milt Jackson's nickname.)



ITEM 4. Ken Cowan Trio

Ken Cowan piano, Hermann Schwaiger on bass and Rob George on drums. J The trio started with **Don't Get Around Much Anymore**, written Duke Ellington. The song was originally entitled "Never No Lament".

They finished with the popular On Green
 Dolphin Street, a 1947 popular song
 composed by Bronisław Kaper with lyrics by
 Ned Washington. The song was composed for
 the film Green Dolphin Street, which was
 based on a 1944 novel of the same name. it
 became a jazz standard in the 1950s.



ITEM 5. Rachel Camerino and her Gentlemen of Jazz

Rachel Camerino vocals, John Calamatta sax, Frank Morgan bass guitar and Paul Phillips drums.

 ♪ Rachel brought us a great version of
 Embraceable You – a jazz standard with music by George Gershwin and lyrics by Ira Gershwin. The song was written in 1928 for an unpublished operetta named *East Is West*.
 ♪ Then she sang Blue Bossa. This tune was originally a blend of hard bop and bossa nova, with lyrics and music composed by Kenny Dorham possibly influenced by Dorham's visit to the Rio de Janeiro Jazz Festival in 1961.





ITEM 6. Café Rio with guest Aneta Graham

Aneta Graham vocals, John Calamatta sax, Paul Phillips drums, Ivan Sultanoff bass guitar and Rory Clark piano.

♪ The band began with a tune made famous by the Nat King Cole Trio in 1945, The Frim Fram Sauce. It was written by Redd Evans and Joe Ricardel and has been recorded by a number of great artists including singer Diana Krall.

A Aneta then sang popular tune, What a
 Difference a Day Makes. The song was
 originally written in Spanish by María Grever,
 a Mexican songwriter, in 1934 with the title
 "Cuando vuelva a tu lado" ("When I Return to
 Your Side").

ITEM 7. Judee's Jeneration

Judee Horin piano and vocals, Paul Phillips drums, Doug Foley bass.

Judee gave us a trio of modern songs starting with Hello. Lionel Richie wrote this ballad for his first album, but changed his mind about including it. His wife Brenda loved the song and convinced him to add it to his second album.

 Their second song was All My Loving; a song by the Beatles, from their second UK album in 1963. It was written by Paul McCartney (credited to Lennon–McCartney), and produced by George Martin. J Judee had enough time for a third song and performed Will You Still Love Me Tomorrow by Carole King and Gerry Goffin.



ITEM 8. Jane Little and Friends

Jane Little vocals, Roger Clark sax, Hermann Schwaiger bass, Ken White guitar, Rory Clark piano.



ITEM 9. Roger Clark and Mates

♫ Roger's combo followed that with the beautiful The Shadow of Your Smile - music by Johnny Mandel and lyrics by Paul Francis Webster. The song was introduced in the 1965 film The Sandpiper, with a trumpet solo by Jack Sheldon.

ITEM 10. Anita Harris and "You're Not My Dad"

Anita Harris vocals, Rory Clark piano, Herman Schwaiger bass and Alan Richards drums. ↓ The first in this pair of tunes was the often heard song, **My Romance.** The tune is a popular jazz song, with music by Richard Rodgers and lyrics by Lorenz Hart, written for Billy Rose's musical, Jumbo (1935). ↓ The second number was **Yesterdays** - a 1933 song about nostalgia composed by Jerome Kern with lyrics by Otto Harbach. They wrote the song for Roberta, a musical based on the novel Gowns by Roberta by Alice Duer Miller.

ITEM 11. Annie Smith and Friends

Annie Smith vocals, Alan Richards drums, Ivan Sultanoff bass and John Curtis piano. ♪ Once again Annie delivered with Steppin' Out with My Baby. This is a popular song written by Irving Berlin and introduced in the 1948 musical film Easter Parade where it was sung by Fred Astaire as part of a dance number involving Astaire on stairs and three different dance partners. Tony Bennett continued to perform this song until his retirement in 2021, at the age of 95. □ She then capped of her set with Billy Joel's New York State of Mind. Though it became a fan favourite and a tune he regularly played live, it was actually never released as a single.

ITEM 12. Charles Armstrong and Friends

Charles Armstrong vocals, Rob George drums, Hermann Schwaiger bass and Ken Cowan piano.

♪ The final act of the night, Charles sang I Could Write a Book, which is a show tune from the 1940 Rodgers and Hart musical Pal Joey where it was introduced by Gene Kelly and Leila Ernst.

Performance Guidelines

There will be 10-12 acts depending on starting time, and we will keep an eye on the clock at the end of the night.

Each act can do whatever they like: any number of songs, chat, jokes, *including* set up and changeover – to last no more than 12 minutes in total.

You may get a gentle reminder from our President if you are starting to go overtime.

The new normal:

- We are continuing to start the <u>draw every month at 7:15</u> and start the <u>music at 7:30</u>. This should enable us to allocate more slots!
- <u>Remember, meals are served from 6pm to 8pm.</u> With the music starting a little earlier, be sure to arrive in plenty of time if you can!
- Those coming from work or a longer distance CAN have a friend or Showbiz member put their name up by 7:15. (But not if you're not attending.)
- Generally the draw order is the peformance order. On the night, bands can negotiate with each other to swap spots. However you cannot choose to move yourself to the carryover list for the following month.





Malvern East RSL - Venue Details

East Malvern RSL, Stanley Grose Dr, Malvern East VIC 3145

Address: Main entrance: Stanley Grose Drive, Malvern East Members & Guests enter via Main Entrance. Take lift or stairs to 1st floor.

Loading Bay for instruments (close to stage): 9 Ellison Street, Malvern East

Parking: Free parking on street in Stanley Grose Drive. If street parking is full: Enter between blue pillars. Due to construction there are fewer parking spots immediately inside, but you can enter between the blue pillars, turn left, down the ramp, and park on the bowling green.

Hours of Function: 6.00 pm to 10.30 pm. Bar is open from 6.00 pm to 10.00 pm. We need to pack up and leave premises by 11.00 pm.

Bar & Food Service: Order drinks at the Bar.

There will be self-serve water, tea & coffee station.

September to November 2023 – book meals with Judee and pay on arrival. And please consider having a meal.

Bookings Essential: All Members and Guests need to book in with Judee Horin on her mobile: 0412 393 403 by Noon the **Thursday prior**. We need to give numbers to the RSL for their catering and table set up requirements.

Room setup: We have requested 6 long tables of 10 people, set up on the floor area in front of the stage. This is in a formation that no-one has their back to the stage, but all see acts side-on. This will vary depending on booking numbers. Stage setup: A drum kit and grand piano and music stands will be provided on the night. We will be using the house PA system – manned by Alan Richards & Doug Foley. Bass players please bring amps.

Check in desk: On entry to the room, please check in with our desk at the entry.
