ITEM 1. Annie and Friends

It was Annie Smith up first on vocals, accompanied by Grahame Taylor on piano, Hermann Schwaiger on bass, Barrie Boyes on sax and Howard Rowe on drums.

♪ Annie began with a great tune written by Jimmy Van Heusen, with lyrics by Johnny Burke: Oh? You Crazy Moon. It was first recorded by Tommy Dorsey in 1939.

♪ Annie's second number was Love Me or Leave Me. (Please never leave us Annie!) With music by Walter Donaldson and lyrics by Gus Kahn, its first live performance and first recording was by Ruth Etting in 1928, though many others including the divine Doris Day have released it over the years.



ITEM 2. Jane Little and Friends

Jane Little (vocals) was joined by Rory Clark on piano, Roger Clark on sax, Hermann Schwaiger on bass and Howard Rowe on drums.

☐ The band followed by heading to the skies with East of the Sun, written by Brooks Bowman.

ITEM 3. Spellbound

Howard Rowe drums, Hermann Schwaiger bass, Barrie Boyes sax and Grahame Taylor piano.

↑ The wonderful **Lullaby of the Leaves** was brought to life first up. A Tin Pan Alley song, it was written by Bernice Petkere and lyricist Joe Young and was first performed in 1932 by George Olson.

☐ It was vintage Spellbound next with Mancini's **Days of Wine and Roses**. With lyrics by Johnny Mercer, it was inspired by a 19th century poem, and was written for the movie of the same name.



ITEM 4. Café Rio

With John Calamatta on sax, Alan Richards on drums, Ivan Sultanoff on bass and Ken Cowan on piano.

 Leader John Calamatta opened a tune known in English as Yellow Days. Originally "La mentira (Se te olvida)", it's a bolero written by Álvaro Carrillo around 1965.

☐ They closed with the 1945 classic, **Give Me the Simple Life**. This popular number was written by Rube Bloom (music) and Harry Ruby (lyrics), and was introduced in the 1946 film *Wake Up and Dream*.

ITEM 5. Stuart Petchey

Stuart Petchey led the band on vocals and was joined by Ray Quon on piano, Doug Foley on bass, John Calamatta on sax and Mark Evartts on drums.

↑ The band began with The Very Thought of You; undoubtedly one of the most oft-played tunes of the 1930s and '40s. Vocalist Al Bowlly introduced this tune in two different recorded versions in 1934.

☐ Cole Porter's **Night and Day** followed shortly thereafter. This tune was first introduced in the broadway play Gay Divorce by Fred Astaire in his first performance without his sister Adele.



ITEM 6. Roger & the Reprobates

Roger Clarke (sax) was joined by Rory Clark on piano and vocals, Hermann Schwaiger on bass and Howard Rowe on drums. ♪ Cole Porter's I Love You was the first tune on offer. Introduced in the 1944 Broadway show Mexican Hayride, it was written by Porter on a bet with actor Monty Woolley. Woolley had challenged Cole to write a hit number titled 'I Love You,' in which that banal phrase would be repeated again and again. They then presented Lucky to be Me − a Leonard Bernstein, Betty Comden, Adolph Green collaboration, sung here by Rory. The

first live performance was by John Battles.

ITEM 7. Charles Armstrong

Vocalist Charles Armstrong was joined by Rory Clark on piano, Roger Clark on sax, Doug Foley on bass and Alan Richards on drums.

♪ For a start, Charles sang Almost Like

Being in Love – from the whimsical musical Brigadoon, with book and lyrics by Alan Jay

Lerner and music by Frederick Lowe. Written in 1947, it charted three times that year courtesy of Frank Sinatra, Mildred Bailey and Mary Martin

☐ The romantic favourite, strongly associated with Nat King Cole, When I Fall in Love closed Charles' set. Composer Victor Young and lyricist Edward Heyman wrote this for the 1952 film One Minute to Zero.

ITEM 8. Duo Melodica, Augmented

Duo Pam Rowe (vocals) and Howard Rowe (drums) were augmented with Doug Foley on bass, Barrie Boyes on sax and Grahame Taylor on piano.

♪ They began with the Victor Schertzinger/Johnny Mercer tune, I Remember You, which was first recorded by Jimmy Dorsey and His Orchestra ♪ They closed with a bright tune written in 1927 by Fred Rose and Walter Hirsch- Deed I Do.



ITEM 9. Mike Powell and Friends

Mike (guitar) was joined by some new and old friends this month: Mark Evartts on drums, Ivan Sultanoff on bass and guest vocalist Fiona Calvert.

↑ Their first tune was the 1929 Fats Waller classic, Honeysuckle Rose.

☐ They finished with Save Your Love for Me. Written by Buddy Johnson, it was first recorded and released by Buddy Johnson and His Orchestra in 1955.



ITEM 10. Hermann's Trio

Rory Clark piano, Herman Schwaiger bass and Howard Rowe drums.

↑ This trio said hello while saying goodbye with **Bye Bye Blackbird**. Two popular "crooners" of the 1920s recorded this standard the year it was published. Gene Austin's version beat out Nick Lucas' in the charts and was in the charts a total of 12 weeks.

☐ The contemplative I Thought About You was the second in their pair of musical offerings. This tune was among the first tunes that lyricist Johnny Mercer collaborated on with composer Jimmy Van Heusen.



ITEM 11. Ashley Thompson and Friends

Singer Ashley Thompson gathered quite a few friends for this set: Mark Evartts on drums, Ivan Sultanoff on bass, Mike Powell on guitar, Colin Garrett on sax and Malcolm Hornby on piano.

♪ Citing Vince Jones as inspiration, Ash sang a tune credited to Herb Ellis, Johnny Frigo, and Lou Carter, **Detour Ahead**. Years later, Frigo would state at public performances that he had written the music and lyrics by himself.

☐ He followed this with **Since I Fell For You**. Composed by Buddy Johnson in 1945, it was first popularized by his sister, Ella Johnson, with Buddy Johnson and His Orchestra.

ITEM 12. Judee's Jeneration

To close the night, it was Judee Horin on piano and vocals, Howard Rowe on drums and Doug Foley on bass.

Judee started with a piano solo – **Ballade Pour Adeline**, made famous in 1977 by pianist Richard Clayderman, composed by Paul de Senneville.

☐ The rest of the band then joined in to finish proceedings with another poignant tune about the bond between parent and child - **Sunrise**, **Sunset**. It hails from the musical Fiddler on the Roof written in 1964 by composer Jerry Bock and lyricist Sheldon Harnick.



Performance Guidelines

There will be 10-12 acts depending on starting time, and we will keep an eye on the clock at the end of the night.

Each act can do whatever they like: any number of songs, chat, jokes, *including* set up and changeover – to last no more than 12 minutes in total.

You may get a gentle reminder from our President if you are starting to go overtime.

The new normal:

- We are continuing to start the <u>draw every month at 7:15</u> and start the <u>music at 7:30</u>. This should enable us to allocate more slots!
- Remember, meals are served from 6pm to 8pm. With the music starting a little earlier, be sure to arrive in plenty of time if you can!
- Those coming from work or a longer distance CAN have a friend or Showbiz member put their name up by 7:15. (But not if you're not attending.)
- Generally the draw order is the performance order. On the night, bands can negotiate with each other to swap spots. However you cannot choose to move yourself to the carryover list for the following month.


Address: Main entrance: Stanley Grose Drive,

Loading Bay for instruments (close to stage): 9 Ellison Street, Malvern East

<u>Parking:</u> Free parking on street in Stanley Grose Drive. If street parking is full: Enter between blue pillars. Due to construction there are fewer parking spots immediately inside, but you can enter between the blue pillars, turn left, down the ramp, and park on the bowling green.



Hours of Function: 6.00 pm to 10.30 pm.

Bar is open from 6.00 pm to 10.00 pm.

We need to pack up and leave premises by 11.00 pm.

Bar & Food Service: Order drinks at the Bar.

There will be self-serve water, tea & coffee station.


September to November 2023 – book meals with Judee and pay on arrival. And please consider having a meal.
