ITEM 1. Judee's Jeneration

With Judee on vocals and piano were Doug Foley on bass and Paul Phillips on drums. Love was the theme of the set.

 Judee and crew began with Beatles tune, All My Loving, which was written by Paul McCartney.

□ And I Love Him (another Beatles favourite)
 followed shortly thereafter. This Lenon McCartney tune was on the album A Hard
 Day's Night.

JJ Judee closed the set with Love is in the Air. This number was a huge hit in Australia when John Paul Young released the tune in 1978 and it peaked at #3 and was also a worldwide hit.

ITEM 2. Zed Difaee

Zed was joined by Judee on backup vocals and piano, Doug Foley on bass and Paul Phillips on drums

♪ Zed's first tune was Love Me Tender, released by Elvis in 1956. Lyrics are credited to "Vera Matson" (though the actual lyricist was her husband, Ken Darby) and Elvis Presley himself. The melody is identical to the sentimental Civil War ballad "Aura Lea" and therefore credited to Aura Lea's composer, the Englishman George R. Poulton.

II Zed finished with You'll Never Walk

Alone from the 1945 Rodgers and Hammerstein musical Carousel.

ITEM 3. Stuart Petchey

Stuart, on vocals, was accompanied by John Curtis on piano, Doug Foley on bass and Paul Phillips on drums.

J The Ray Noble number, The Very Thought of You was first cab off the proverbial rank. Released in 1944, it was Ray Noble himself who first recorded it. It reached number one, and stayed there for five weeks.

☐ The next number was I've Never Been in Love Before. It was written by Frank Loesser for the 1950 musical Guys and Dolls where it was first performed by Robert Alda & Isabel Bigley.

ITEM 4. Vincent O'Connor and Chris Whorlow

Vincent on vocals, Chris on piano accordion.

↑ Their opening number was Amapola; a
1920 song by Spanish American composer
José María Lacalle García (Joseph Lacalle),
who also wrote the original lyrics in Spanish.

↑ The Merry Widow Waltz followed, from an operetta by the Austro-Hungarian composer
Franz Lehár.

Café, made famous by The Fureys. a Dutch language song, released in 1975, composed and written by the Dutch composer and singer Pierre Kartner, who recorded and performed most of his work under the stage name 'Vader Abraham' (father Abraham).




ITEM 5. Rachel Camerino and her Gentlemen of Jazz

Rachel gathered the following gents to make music this month: John Calamatta (sax), John Curtis (piano), Doug Foley (bass) and Paul Phillips (drums).

♪ Rachel was feeling, and singing **Misty** for her first tune. This perennial favourite was written in 1954 by pianist Erroll Garner.

☐ She switched gears and sang a classic Ben E. King number for her second song: **Stand By Me**. This was originally performed in 1961 by American singer-songwriter Ben E. King and written by him, along with Jerry Leiber and Mike Stoller

ITEM 7. Charles Armstrong

It was Daniel Ossher on piano, Doug Kuhn on bass, Roger Clark on sax, Mike Powell on guitar and Paul Philips on drums who joined Charles on stage.

♪ The bracket began with .Desafinado
(Slightly Out of Tune); a Latin staple composed by Antonio Carlos Jobim and strongly associated with Julie London.

♪ Charles brought us closure with On a Clear Day. Burton Lane wrote the music and Alan J Lerner the lyrics for the 1965 Tony Award winning musical, On A Clear Day You Can See Forever. Barbara Streisand eventually recorded the tune for the film version of the musical.

ITEM 8. Jan Arndt and Graham Taylor

(Vocals and piano respectively.)

↑ This duo's first song was Falling in Love Again (Can't Help It) - a 1930 German song composed by Friedrich Hollaender as "Ich bin von Kopf bis Fuß auf Liebe eingestellt" (literally: "I am, from head to toe, ready for love").

☐ They then performed the Cole Porter classic, I've Got You Under My Skin.
☐ The pair finished with La Vie En Rose, made famous by Edith Piaf, who is also responsible for the French lyrics. She originally wrote them for music composed by Louiguy, but it's said that it was probably Robert Chauvigny who completed the music...

ITEM 9. Anita Harris and Friends

This group (hey, it's me!) featured Anita something on vocals, Doug Kuhn on bass, Kim Harris on piano and Alan Richards on drums.

♪ Anita's laid back first number was **Don't**Worry 'Bout Me. It was composed in 1938 by
Rube Bloom, with lyrics written by Ted
Koehler and was introduced in the "World's
Fair" edition of the Cotton Club show.

☐ These friends closed the set and the night with an Alan Richards' favourite; The Things We Did Last Summer. With music by Jule Styne and lyrics by Sammy Cahn, it was first recorded by the Chairman of the Board – Frank Sinatra.















Showbiz Club March Night — and Beyond: What you need to know

For the first time in remembered Showbiz history, we have 10 carryover acts. Given we also have a President's guest who is only in the country this month, our dance card is full.

We are also growing as a club. While we hope this won't happen often, the committee met this month to discuss strategies to increase the number of performances while <u>retaining the carryover policy</u>. We want to do everything we can to avoid people missing out two months in a row when they attend.

So, here's what's going on.

- In March, the ten carryovers listed at the bottom of this page will automatically be given a slot if they come. There will be no draw. (Small bonus: this should save a little time.)
- Those who are strictly NOT on the list below can put their name on the paper, and will get a guaranteed slot the following get-together. Given there are 11 carryovers, we're hoping the next list will be manageable.
- We are now going to start the <u>draw every month at 7:15</u> and start the music at 7:30. This should enable us to allocate more slots!
- Remember, meals are served from 6pm to 8pm. With the music starting a little earlier, be sure to arrive in plenty of time if you can!
- Those coming from work or a longer distance CAN have a friend or Showbiz member put their name up by 7:15. (But not if you're not attending.)
- Generally the draw order is the peformance order but, on the night, bands can negotiate with each other to swap spots. However you cannot choose to move yourself to the carryover list for the following month.

Performance Guidelines


There will be 10-12 acts depending on starting time, though we will have to keep an eye on the clock at the end of the night. And don't let your act be the one that pushes someone else off the program.


Bookings Essential: All Members and Guests need to book in with Judee Horin on her mobile: 0412 393 403 by
