Hello Dear Friends!



ITEM 1. Chas and Dan

This duo comprised Charles Armstrong on vocals accompanied by Daniel Ossher on piano.

J Charles and Daniel opened the night with a lovely version of I've Never Been in Love Before. This song was written by Frank Loesser and published in 1950. The song is a duet from the 1950 musical *Guys and Dolls*.

J Followed by the popular My Funny Valentine a show tune from the 1937 Richard Rogers and Lorenz Hart Musical *Babes in Arms*. It became a Jazz standard covered by over 600 artists. One of these was Chet Baker who made it his signature song.

ITEM 2. Mike Powell & Friends

Fronted by Mike Powell on guitar with friends Paul Phillips on drums, Eiji Takemoto on bass and Daniel Ossher on piano.

- ↑ They played one of the most frequently recorded songs of all time, **Tea For Two.** It was composed in 1824 by Vincent Youmans with lyrics by Irving Caesar. In 1972 Vincent was inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame for this song.
- ☐. We were then treated to the lovely theme from The Odd Couple. Composer Neil Hefti was an American jazz trumpeter composer and arranger. He wrote music for the Odd Couple movie and TV series and also for the Batman TV series.





ITEM 3. Jane Little and Friends

Act 3 was made up of Jane Little on vocals, Roger Clark on sax, Ken White on guitar, Larry Kean on drums and Rory Clark on piano. If Once again a lovely version of When Sunny Gets Blues, a song written by Marvin Fisher (music) and Jack Secal (lyrics) which has become a jazz standard. A smash hit for Johnny Mathis and sung by many others. If She followed that with the bright I Love Being Here with You; a song written by Peggy Lee and Bill Schluger. Released on Capitol in 1961, it was the B side to her Bucket of Tears and it quickly became a popular song with other artists.

ITEM 4. Café Rio

This band featured John Calamatta on sax, Larry Kean on drums, Eiji Takemoto on bass and Daniel Ossher on piano.

John selected a rare tune especially because it was by Peter Martin called Cuba New Orleans (also known as Guarachas Parish). It was released in May 2020 and was written by Peter.

☐ His second interesting choice was Soul Station — an acknowledged masterpiece written by Hank Mobley. It was released in 1960 on Blue Note Records and the album from which it hails is considered by many critics as Hank's finest album.



ITEM 5. Duo Melodica Augmented

The traditional duo of Pam Rowe on vocals and Howard Rowe on drums was enriched with Doug Kühn on bass, Roger Clark on sax and Rory Clark on piano.

J Up first was Dream a Little Dream. The tune is a 1931 composition by Fabian Andre and Wilbur Schwandt with lyrics by Gus Kahn. It was originally recorded by Ozzie Nelson and his Orchestra.

☐ To mark the passing of Astrud Giberto this week, it was great to hear **The Girl from Ipanema** (Garota de ipanema) - a Brazilian bossa nova by Antonio Carlos Jobim with lyrics in Portuguese by Vincius de Moraes and in English lyrics by Norman Gimbel.

ITEM 6. Jan Arndt

Jan Arndt on vocals was joined by Graeme Davies on harmonica and sax, Rob George on drums and Ken Cowan on piano.

↑ Their opening number was the popular jazz standard, **Body & Soul**, written in 1930 with music by Johnny Green and lyrics by Edward Heyman, Robert Sour and Frank Eyton for British Actress Gertrude Lawrence, It was used as the musical theme in the film noir drama of the same name.



Jan then had time to give us **Teach Me Tonight**. The music was written by Gene De Paul and the lyrics by Sammy Cahn in 1953.

ITEM 7. Frank, Stu and Andrew

This band featured Stuart Cardell on vocals, Frank Morgan on bass, Andrew Worth on guitar, Daniel Ossher on piano and Paul Phillips on drums

♪ It was lovely to see such a mix of returning members, new members and guests performing **Moon River.** a song composed by Henry Mancini with lyrcis by Johnny Mercer. It was originally performed by Audrey Hepburn in the 1961 movie *Breakfast at Tiffanys*. She actually sang the song herself when in other movies she used a ghost singer.

Boy. Recorded in 1948, it was written by Eden Ahbez as a tribute to Bill Pester who promoted the hippie-style philosophy adapted by Ahbez. It was handed to Nat and when he decided to record and needed permission from Ahbez, he couldn't be found. They eventually found him living hippie style under the Hollywood sign in the hills of Hollywood.

ITEM 8. Margaret Morrison

Guest Margaret Morrison on vocals was joined by Rory Clark on piano, Hermann Schwaiger on bass and Larry Kean on drums. The wonderful music continued on with Margaret and trio smashing Almost Like Being in Love - a show tune with music by Frederick Loewe and lyrics Alan Jay Lerner. It was written for the 1947 musical, *Brigadoon*. This was followed by a fabulous performance of The Nearness Of You, written in 1937 by the great Hoagy Carmichael with lyrics by Ned Washington. The song was intended for a film called *Romance in the Rough* and Paramount registered and published the song in



anticipation, but it never appeared in the film. It was first recorded by Chick Bullock and his Orchestra.



ITEM 9. F-Troup

F-Troupe featured Ken Forbes on trumpet and vocals, with Roger Clark on sax, Larry Kean on drums and Rory Clark on piano.

♪ They started with one of the most popular songs of the 20th Century, **Besame Mucho**; a bolero song written by Mexican Consuleo Velazquez with English lyrics by Sunny Skylar. It's one of the most recorded and covered songs in Spanish of all time. The tune appeared in *Follow the Boys* in 1944.

ITEM 10. Vincent O'Connor

Vincent was accompanied by Judee Horin on piano.

J It was a joy to hear our Irish leprechaun (bit too tall though for a leprechaun) sing "a lovely Irish ditty A Mother's Love is a Blessing", composed by Thomas P Keenan.

☐ He then sang **Rose Marie**, written in 1924 for an operetta of the same name. Made famous by Nelson Eddy.

Young. Richard Tauber released this as a single in 1939, and also wrote the lyrics.





ITEM 11. Roger Clark Quintet

Led by Roger Clark on sax the band also featured Ken White on guitar, Doug Kühn on bass, Larry Kean on drums and Rory Clark on piano.

♪ The band's first choice was the popular On Green Dolphin Street (composed in 1947 by Bronislaw Kaper with lyrics by Ned Washington. The song was based on a 1944 novel of the same name; it's the name of the prison, the primary setting of the story.
♪ Their second choice and the final for the night had been already played earlier but of course they put their own spin on it – Meditation. It's a song that has been translated into several languages with different names.

The new normal:


- We are continuing to start the <u>draw every month at 7:15</u> and start the <u>music at 7:30</u>. This should enable us to allocate more slots!

Due to lack of staff – we will advise how to receive food order.


Menu: There will be 4 Main Courses (\$22), and 1 Dessert (\$5). Advise Judee of dietary requirements.
