


A Word from Our President

ITEM 1. Smooth As

The night began with John Curtis on piano, Ken Forbes on trumpet, Hermann Schwaiger on bass and Larry Kean on drums.

♪ Smooth As opened our Showbiz night with Alone Together; lyrics by Howard Dietz composed by Arthur Schwartz. The first jazz musician to release this tune was Artie Shaw in 1939.

♫ They followed up with Besame Mucho (Kiss Me a Lot), which is a bolero song written by Mexican songwriter Consuelo Velazquez.



ITEM 2. Jane Little and Friends

Jane's friends were Ken Cowan on piano, Doug Kuhn on bass, Larry Kean on drums and John Calamatta on sax.

 ♪ The first number was Easy to Love written by Cole Porter for William Gaxton to sing in the 1934 Broadway show Anything Goes.
 ♪ Jane then sang Nice Work if You Can Get It with music by George Gershwin and lyrics by Ira Gershwin. The title phrase "Nice work if you can get it" came from an English Magazine. It's one of the nine songs the Gershwin Brothers wrote for the movie A Damsel in Distress.

ITEM 3. Barry Wilks

Barry was accompanied by Kim Harris on piano, Doug Kuhn on bass and Alan Richards on drums.

♪ Barry sang A Little Street Where Old

ITEM 4. Ken Cowan Trio

Ken Cowan on piano, Hermann Schwaiger on bass, and Robert George on drums ♪ This trio entertained us with Laverne Walk, made popular by Stan Getz and composed in 1939 by Oscar Pettiford - double bassist, cellist and composer. Pettiford was one of the earliest musicians to work in the bebop idiom. He died much too young, just before his 38th birthday, of a virus related to polio.

ITEM 5. Café Rio

Consisting of John Curtis on piano, Doug Foley on bass, Paul Phillips on drums and John Calamatta on sax.

♫ They followed this with Wave ("Vou Te Contar" in Portuguese; "I am going to tell you" in English), which is a Bossa Nova and jazz standard written by Antonio Carlos Jobim. Originally released as an instrumental in 1967, the English lyrics were written by Jobim himself later that year.

ITEM 6. Daniel Ossher and Friends

This group featured Daniel Ossher on piano, Hermann Schwaiger on bass and Paul Phillips on drums.

♪ They offered great entertainment, beginning with Well You Needn't written in 1944 by Thelonious Monk. The name was inspired by singer Charlie Beamon, who, when told the song would be named for him, replied "Well, you need not" or words to that effect.
 ♪ And then the beautiful What Are You Doing the Rest of Your Life, which is a song with lyrics written by Alan Bergman and Marilyn Bergman and original music written by Michel Legrand for the 1969 film The Happy Ending.





ITEM 7. Jan Arndt and Friends

Jan Arndt vocals, Ray Quon on piano, Hermann Schwaiger on bass, Alan Richards on drums.

 ♪ Jan's first song was Nevertheless I'm in Love with You (sometimes referred to simply as Nevertheless). This jazz classic was written by Harry Ruby with lyrics by Bert Kalmar, and was first published in 1931. It was a hit for Jack Denny that year.
 ♫. She followed that with September in the Rain - a nostalgic song written by Harry Warren and AI Dubin in 1937. The song was introduced by James Melton in the film Melody for Two.

ITEM 8. Samuel Kristy and Charles Armstrong

Samuel Kristy on piano and Charles Armstrong on vocals were joined by Larry Kean on drums, Doug Kuhn on bass and John Calamatta on sax.

 ♪ They gave us a beautiful rendition of Autumn Leaves (Le Feuilles Mortes) written by Jospeh Kosma in 1945 with original lyrics in French by Jacques Prevert and later Johnny Mercer wrote lyrics in English.
 ♫ Charles followed this with a lovely version of I Left My Heart in San Francisco. It was written in the fall of 1953 in Brooklyn NY with music by George Cory and lyrics by Douglass Cross, and is best known as the signature song of Tony Bennett.

ITEM 9. Judee Horin's Olivia Newton John Tribute

Led by Judee Horin on piano and vocals, the band included Doug Foley on bass, Mike Powell on guitar and Paul Phillips on drums.

Judee did a tribute to the wonderful Olivia Newton-John starting with I Honestly Love You. The song became a worldwide hit and remained Olivia's signature solo song until the 1981 hit Physical. The song was written by Jeff Barry and Peter Allen.

 A Next up was Hopelessly Devoted to You, written by Australian John Farrer for the film Grease.in 1978. Olivia performed this at the 21st Grammy Awards in 1979.

JJ Judee closed with another *Grease* classic, You're the One That I Want, also written by John Farrer and performed with John Travolta in the film. This song was one of the bestselling singles in history with over 15 million copies being sold.

ITEM 10. Stuart Petchey and Friends

With vocals by Stuart, John Curtis on piano, Doug Foley on bass, Paul Phillips on drums and John Calamatta on sax.

ITEM 11. Rachel Camerino and her Gentlemen of Jazz

Closing the night were Rachel Camerino vocals, John Curtis piano, Doug Foley bass, Paul Phillips drums and John Calamatta on sax. ♪ The take off: **Fly Me to the Moon**, originally titled "In Other Words" written in 1954 by Bart Howard and first recorded by Kaye Ballard. Frank Sinatra's 1964 version was closely associated with the Apollo mission to the Moon. ♬ Rachel's final song was **The Nearness of You**, a 1938 composition by Hoagy Carmichael with lyrics by Ned Washington. The song debuted in the 1938 movie *Romance in the Dark*.



Members & Guests enter via Main Entrance. Take lift or stairs to 1st floor.

Loading Bay for instruments (close to stage): 9 Ellison Street, Malvern East

<u>Parking</u>: Free parking on street in Stanley Grose Drive.

If street parking is full: Enter between blue pillars, there are about 8 carparks just inside.

Or enter between blue pillars, turn left, down ramp, and park on Bowling Green.

Hours of Function: 6.00 pm to 10.30 pm. Kitchen is open to order from 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm.

Bar is open from 6.00 pm to 10.00 pm.

We need to pack up and leave premises by 11.00 pm.

Bar & Food Service: Order drinks and food at Bar.
