ITEM 1. Barry Wilks

- ♪ Barry opened the night's entertainment with the lovely **Buona Sera** (sometimes titled "Buona Sera, Signorina") a song written by Carl Sigman and Peter De Rose, performed by Louis Prima & his Orchestra in 1957.



ITEM 2. Judee Horin

Judee Horin entertained with vocals and piano playing accompanied by Doug Foley on Bass, Howard Rowe on Drums and Barrie Boyes on Tenor Sax

- First tune was **Who Can I Turn To** from *The Roar of the Crowd the Smell of the Paint* written by Anthony Newley and Leslie Bricusse published in 1964.
- She followed this with I Gotta Be Me from the Broadway musical Golden Rainbow. This was written in 1967 by Walter Marks.

- ✓ Vincent opened with Little Town in the Ould County Down. This was written by Monte Carlo, Alma M. Sanders and Richard W. Pascoe and was first released by John McCormack in 1921.
- A rousing chorus of Drink Drink (The Drinking Song) followed shortly thereafter. This tune is from operetta The Student Prince, with music by Sigmund Romberg and words by Dorothy Donnelly.



ITEM 5. Ken Cowen Trio

This trio comprised Ken Cowan Piano, Hermann Schweiger on Bass and Robert George on Drums

- ♪ The Trio played two great tunes. They began with **Wave** (also known as "Vou Te Contar"; a bossa nova and jazz standard written by Antonio Carlos Jobim, recorded as an instrumental and then he put english lyrics to it later in1967.



GAUL BLATTER: A French horn player GREGORIAN CHAMP: The title bestowed upon the monk who can hold a note the longest


PLACEBO DOMINGO: A faux tenor
